Students are encouraged to declare anthropology as a major before registeringeroresteclasses of their junior year. None of the required courses or level anthropology courses lilling the major may be taken on an S/U basiscept AN 365 and AN 399

The anthropology major must successfully complete a minimum of 11 counts as credits in anthropology as follows:

1. Introduction and Exploration

- a. Introduction: AN 101 and AN 102 (students maket the courses in either orderconcurrently AN 101H and 102Hare also occasionally offered and meet this requirement
- b. Geographicarea requirement: one course among AN 205, AN 207, AN 2008224, AN 227, AN 229 (AN 252 may also count when applicable)

2. Foundation

Completion of the foundation requirements is strongly recommended as preparation for courses and study abroathese courses must be taken at Skidmore.

- a. Research Methods: AN 201 (Ethnographic) or AN 202 (Archaeologic a) fered Fall only.
- b. History of AnthropologicalThought: AN 270Offered every Fall and occasionally in Spring

3. Application and Synthesis

- a. Two 300-level anthropology courses totaling at least 6 creditese courses must be taken at Skidmore.
- b. One additional 300evel anthropology course for 4 credits [either a course designated R (research), W (writing), or V (visual analysis) or any special topics course designated as AN 351D, 352D, or 353D Must be taken in the senior year at Skidmore.
- c. The senior capstone course in anthropology: AN 365 Applying Anthropologyst be taken in Fall of senior year.

4. Additional credits and electives

In addition to the above, students must take additional credits at any level as necessary to complete therequired 33 credits for the major. To fulfill college maturity requirements, at least six credits of 300-level anthropology courses must be taken in the senior year.
